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LITERATURE REVIEW

Ervin-Tripp (1972) explains that four main factors as markers of language choice of speakers in social interaction: (1) setting (time and place) and situation, (2) participants in the interaction, (3) topic of conversation, and (4) function of the interaction.

Groesjean (1982, p. 136) suggests four factors that influence the choice of language in social interaction: (1) participants, (2) situation, (3) content of discourse, and (4) function of interaction.



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METHOD

This research uses a sociolinguistic theoretical approach

Particularly, this research employed three data collection techniques, namely (1) observation, (2) interview, and (3) documentation.

Instrument: Modification of the Basa Urang Project Interview Package by Cohn, et al (2013).

The findings on socio-cultural factors that determine language selection include five factors, namely:




