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#### INTRODUCTION

- Al is transforming language learning and assessment.
- Pre-intermediate EFL learners struggle with creative writing and revision.
- Limited teacher time restricts personalized feedback in non-formal classes.
- Need for efficient tools to support formative writing assessment.

- Self-assessment supports learner autonomy (Boud & Falchikov, 2007).
- Al tools like GPT offer fast, scalable writing feedback.

Design	Classroom-based qualitative study
Task Type	2 creative stories (midterm & final exams)
Assessment Tool	ChatGPT (GPT-4)
Assessment Criteria	Creativity, Grammar, Vocabulary, Structure, Coherence
Feedback Cycle	GPT comments, targeted feedback and improvement worksheets.

Kalila	Heartwarming theme, moral clarity	Word choice, opening/ending strength, sentence fluency



## Study Suggestions Based on GPT Feedback

#### **Personalized Practice Guidance:**

Student	Recommended Focus Areas	Suggested Activities
Audreya	Punctuation, transition use, story layering	Dialogue punctuation drills, rewriting with connectors, metaphor writing
Afifa	Sentence variety, grammar range	Sentence combining games, descriptive writing prompts, peer editing tasks
Alya	Verb consistency, vivid expression	Tense transformation practice, emotional vocabulary exercises
Kalila	Word choice, sentence fluency, story hook/ending	Thematic vocabulary sets, read- and-retell, story starter/closer worksheets



## **GPT's Role in Supporting Writing Assessment**

Contribution	Details
Formative Feedback	GPT provided specific, immediate feedback on 5 writing criteria
Autonomy & Reflection	Helped students identify strengths and revise their own work
Time Efficiency	Saved teacher time while offering personalized support
Differentiated Instruction	Matched suggestions to each student's level and writing needs
Teacher-GPT Partnership	GPT worked best with teacher mediation — not as a replacement
